Our GLS Ministry Connect program saw expanded growth, and we were able to provide the GLS, free of charge, to transition homes, homeless shelters, crisis centers, at-risk youth and trafficking survivors.



Our GLS Prison Program shifted as corrections facilities across the U.S. were hit particularly hard by Covid-19 last year. However, with passion and desire to provide encouragement, our prison volunteers and team were willing to shift with us, and with your financial support, we were able to deliver the GLS to 9,000+ incarcerated men and women in 2020.




