- Bet on your own curiosity.
- Test the idea on other people to see if they share that curiosity.
- Believe that you have something to contribute.

Identifying with Great Characters (3:15)

- Remarkable characters in extraordinary circumstances are still human beings, and there is far more that we have in common with them than not.
- Many stories are not just about the event, but about relationships, and we all can be fascinated by the impact of a relationship.
- Look for that what's relatable.

Creating Lifelong Partnerships (4:36)

- It's about compatibility, the ability to grow, and communication.
- Being together a long time should not be thought of as a burden or obligation.
- You tell true stories as proof that remarkable outcomes can be achieved.

Leading a Team (7:52)

- Have a team mentality.
- Create an environment that brings out the best in people, but also, within that framework, it's understood that people are going to be challenged.
- If you can share and agree upon the goals, people can make tremendous contributions.
